## Secretary's Report

for February 13, 2007 membership meeting, by Mel Suarez

Al Prudhomme started the meeting at 730pm.

About 20 people attended at the Lexington VFW. Snow was starting to fall.

#### Treasurer's Report

John Hatfield said the club's bank balance as of 1/30/07 is \$2,625.68. No major expenses were expected in the near futuure so the club should begin the flying season with about \$3,000. (See the detailed report on page 3 of this issue).

#### Membership Report

While no new members were in attendance, Al mentioned his brief encounter with new member Dave from Maryland. Dave was flying an electric helicopter (T-Rex). Cesar and Naeder were also at the field and were very enthusiastic about honing their flying skills.

#### Field Report

Jack reported that the tarp covering on the lean-to was flapping in the wind and had to be removed. A few weeks ago, several members chopped some wood. It has been very useful for keeping flyers warm during winter flights. Al added that Tony Covino brought a steel drum and it was staked down near the tree line.

The field sign took some damage a while back and still needs to be repaired as does the wind sock and pole.

There has been no big movement on the Cummings property.

#### Membership Report

John Hatfield informed the

group that as of this date there were 50 members.

#### Coffee Break

Al scheduled Bill of Bill's Hobby Barn to give a short presentation. Al and Bill couldn't quite get it to work and Bill was a no-show.

Jack continued the field conversation by mentioning the tarp was ripped by the wind. The club ordered two more for \$70/each. For future winters, the tarps will be dismantled.

From the peanut gallery erupted, "We should be cutting down all the weeds around the flying field." Juhan felt the current mechanism for cutting is not efficient. We need a weed cutter twice the size of our current mower. The tractor took 2.5 hours and that's a \$40k machine! Dave said he is pricing out alternatives and the membership agreed with the new strategy. Dave will be investigating State auctions.

Lastly, Al mentioned that the Middlesex/BRCF auction was a good time. Jack and Al helped in the kitchen and enjoyed the experience. "From the beginning of the day, the school turned into a professional auction."

Vic Naimo brought the video library. There are several videos available although Jack needs to bone up on his flying skills and took several.


